As a parent or teacher accompanying your students on a field trip, you are important in helping us make this a great experience for everyone involved! Here are a few guidelines to help you prepare:



- Set a Good Example
 - Be a good example for students to follow—pay attention to presentations, help students with activities, respect wildlife and plants.
 - Help students keep track of their personal possessions, and remind them not to litter or leave anything behind—especially during snack time or lunch.
- Help monitor student behavior
 - Remind students to raise their hand when asking a question, and to listen when other students are speaking.
 - If a student is not paying attention or misbehaving, gently guide that student to acting more respectfully.
- Safety
 - Remind students to drink water, wear sunscreen, and watch where they are walking.
 - Keep track of how many students are in your group and make sure that none of them wander off.
 - If a student needs to leave the group to go to the bathroom or for another reason, be sure an adult is always with them until they return.
- Technology
 - In general, we discourage the use of cell phones or iPads on field trips. Our goal is to get students aware of nature and to enjoy being outside! If iPads are part of a student assignment, we ask that these only be used in between stations, at lunch time, or with the permission of the volunteer leader at the end of a presentation.
